

## Lincewood Primary School 2015 - 16

### **What is The Pupil Premium?**

The Pupil premium is a sum of money the school receives for each pupil who is either in receipt of Free School Meals (FSM) or who is eligible to receive them and for children who are 'Looked After' by the Local Authority.

Nationally, the statistics show that pupils who are in receipt of FSM or who are 'Looked After' or adopted do less well than their peers in national tests. The aim of this money is to try to close that attainment gap. Lincewood Primary School has more students who are in receipt of FSM when compared with other schools nationally, although we do have less than some schools in Essex.

We are required to publish how much Pupil Premium money we receive, how we have chosen to spend that money, and how well pupils entitled to FSM or 'Looked After' achieve in comparison with those who are not. This is the gap that we are working hard to narrow.

### **How much Pupil Premium do we receive?**

In 2015-2016 we received pupil premium for 102 pupils. Each pupil entitled to Free School Meals received £1320.00 and children who are 'Looked After' or those who have been adopted received £1900.00. This equated to £147,940.

### **What do we spend the money on?**

- Subsidising the cost of curriculum trips, school journeys and residential trips to make them affordable for everyone.
- LSA staff costs for delivering specific intervention programmes for pupils not on track to achieve age related expectations at the end of both Key Stage One and Two.
- Extra teachers hours to provide greater differentiation in specific lessons and for targeted group work.
- A structured programme of 'outdoor education' to enhance our broad and balanced curriculum.
- Providing one to one support for children with specific educational needs.
- Holiday activities.
- Providing additional classroom accommodation to enable extra groups and setting to take place.

### **Outcomes**

- \* Disadvantaged KS2 pupils' progress was not significantly below average (and not below -3) overall or for any prior attainment group in any subject.
- \* For KS1 disadvantaged pupils, attainment of at least the expected standard in all subjects for all EYFS development groups was close to (within one pupil below national) or above national figures for other pupils.
- \* The proportion of disadvantaged pupils that met the expected standard in phonics was above the national figure for other pupils in Year 1.
