Please note that 8 basic tasks will give you 56 points; that is less than 2 a week.

<p>Maths and problem solving</p>	<p>Time yourself and see how long it takes you to do: 30 star jumps 30 lunges 30 burpees</p> <p>What was the total time spent to the exercises? Can you order your activities from slowest to quickest?</p>	<p>4 children describe their birthdays.</p> <p>Mo: My birthday is the first day of the second month.</p> <p>Teddy: I was born on the 15th of June.</p> <p>Eva: I was born on the last day of the year!</p> <p>Dora: I was born two days before Mo.</p> <p>Can you work out their birthdays and order them from earliest to latest in the year? How can you describe your birthday?</p>	<p>Ask an adult to split a chocolate bar into 5 unequal parts. Can you identify what fraction of the original bar is in each group?</p> <p>For example, if I had 4 squares it would be $\frac{1}{2}$. If I had 2 squares it would be $\frac{1}{4}$.</p> <p>Take photos and stick them in your homework book.</p>
<p>Topic</p>	<p>Science – Draw or take photographs of 5 different flowers you see when you are out and about. Can you label the pictures with the names of the different parts of the flower?</p> <p>DT – Research some floral cross-stitch designs using a computer, you can print the pictures out or draw them. Make a collage of the pictures and write some accompanying notes to say why you like the designs. 10 points</p>	<p>Geography – Using the template provided, write a short paragraph about a place you have visited in Essex. Describe the location – is it woodland or the seafront? Also try to include any important facts you may know about the area as well.</p> <p>Music – Listen to the song 'Three Little Birds' by Bob Marley, can you write out the lyrics and memorise them? You can then perform the song to an audience at home. Remember to find the pulse and rhythm of the song to keep in time with the music 10 points</p>	<p>RE – Talk to someone in your family who is married or who has been to a wedding. Prepare some questions to find out about the ceremony – for example, where was the ceremony held? What did the bride wear? Now use your responses to create a fact sheet all about weddings. 10 points</p> <p>Spanish – Create a calendar in Spanish! You can use drawings or pictures – design it how you want, but the days of the week and months of the year must be written in Spanish. You can also use a computer to design your calendar if you are confident with ICT.</p>
